- $\hookrightarrow$ Need to know what circumvention tools are used for
- $\hookrightarrow$ Specifically, need to know which websites are likely to be censored

## Lists found in the wild...

- Citizen Lab, 2014: 10,600 URLs in synthetic list intended to probe for censorship
- Herdict, 2009-2014: 65,000 URLs reported as inaccessible (not necessarily censored) by users worldwide
- Per-country lists, 2009, 2012, 2014: eight leaked or reverse-engineered lists of URLs and/or sites allegedly censored in specific countries; 100-20,000 entries each.

## What is being censored?

- Citizen Lab's list has categories
- The other lists do not
- Context may provide clues
- Tedious, unpleasant manual work in general
- Need to understand language of site; machine translation probably not good enough

"Total failures" is an underestimate.

## Technical challenges

To know if a page still exists and is accessible:

- You must use a feature-complete web browser.
- Sites often try to detect and block crawlers.
- <meta refresh> and JavaScript redirection are remarkably popular.
- The "interesting" content may be entirely within <iframe>s.
- You may have to have a human look at it.
- Some short-URL services, like v.gd, don't redirect automatically.
- Some sites (including e.g. Youtube) respond to requests for removed content with a 200 OK.
- You may need to know what used to be there.
- "according to archive.org the domain facegoo. com is since at least 3 years not an porn website anymore. Now it is the website of an iPhone App for fun picture manipulation." - bpjmleak
- "Parked" domains often respond to any URL with a successful page load that has nothing to do with the original content.


## Linguistic and cultural challenges

This is Dungan. It's not a Slavic language; it's a close relative of Mandarin, spoken by an ethnic minority living mostly in Kazakhstan these days.
It's written using Cyrillic instead of Hanzi because of the Soviet Union's literacy programs in the 1950s.

fails to match paingate.com
"irgend.ein.name" does not act as a wildcard
Many variations on this URL show the same video.
In the original, the last character of "PkiDwUwowrl" was ambiguous

## UnANSWERED QUESTIONS

- How do we improve our lists of sites \& pages to test?
- Human curation, mechanical collection, and leaked filter configurations all have downsides
- Human analysis is necessary but difficult, demoralizing, and expensive
- To what extent should we try to discern the intent of the censor, versus what the censor actually does?
- How can we ensure that our tests reflect reality "on the ground"?
- How can we minimize risk to research collaborators "on the ground"?
